Reception



Remembrance Day



In the Family Tree Cafe on Tuesday morning the parents were joined by Jasmine Pugh, a learning coordinator from Adult Education in Gloucestershire. Jasmine would like to offer our parents the opportunity to participate in a range of courses, to be held at school, in the new year.

There may be a cost for people in work, but this is assessed on an individual basis.

• Participants must be over the age of 19 and a UK/EEU resident in the last 3 years

To qualify for a free place, participants must be or have one of the following;

- 1. Unemployed
- 2. Earning below £18,525.00
- 3. Retired
- 4. Learning Disability, Learning Difficulty, Mental health difficulty
- 5. Qualified below level 2 (less than 5 GCSES)

If for whatever reason a parent/carer doesn't meet the eligibility criteria, then there is usually a charge of £5 per adult per session.
