

School News



We are all learning about learning



This week the adults at Beech Green met to talk about the next whole school learning focus. We believe it is our responsibility to remain interested and informed about educational research. Over the last year teachers gained a greater understanding of the importance of retrieval practice. This led to a change in how often children revisit topics; we think this has made a huge difference to what they can remember in all areas of the curriculum.

Understanding how all children learn informs what we do every day; it is our job to try to cater for individual needs. Throughout the rest of this academic year teachers and teaching partners will research ways to work with pupils that find learning difficult. We take our jobs seriously, as dedicated professionals everyone wants every child to achieve their best. We are determined to seek out strategies that enable the most reluctant learners to work hard and make progress.

Working with parents and carers is one way we can make a bigger difference. This week the EYFS team shared their survey results with us; published below, it clearly shows that in many ways our communication with you is effective. There is always more we can do and so I would like to once again invite you to attend a family voice meeting on Tuesday 7th March 2pm or 6pm. Please join me if you can to have your say about the planned changes to our school.

QLC Cross-country competition

On Monday Beech Green hosted the annual Cross-country competition for all the local primary schools in the Quedgeley Learning Community. Five schools (ourselves, Field Court Jnr, Meadowside, Clearwater and Longney) participated in six races: girls and then boys in the Y1 & 2 races over 600 m, the Y3 & 4 races over 1.2 km and the Y5 & 6 races over 1.8 km. With the top five finishers in each race earning points for their schools, there were tremendous efforts from all the children, some of whom were so determined that they even managed sprint finishes! In the end, Beech Green ran-out event winners on 53 points, 14 points ahead of the second-placed school. Well done to all our fantastic runners!
