<p><b>Coin hunt.</b> Go and collect together all the loose coins in your house, Can you sort them into different types and learn how much they are worth? Can you make a shop with your toys and practise buying things with the coins?</p>	<p><b>Explore capacity.</b> Find different containers in your house. Which one holds the most/least? How many small containers would it take to fill a big one? Can you order the containers according to their size?</p>	<p><b>Den building.</b> Use sheets and pegs to make an awesome den. Once you have finished it, can you take a photograph and put it on Tapestry for your teachers to see? Can you make a sign to tell people about your den?</p>	<p><b>Throwing and Catching.</b> Practise throwing and catching with different sized balls. What is the largest number of throws you can do without dropping the ball? Who can you throw and catch the best with? Is it easier to let the ball bounce before you catch it?</p>
<p><b>Technology hunt.</b> Can you find all the things that need to be plugged in or turned on to work. Can you write or draw the things you find?</p>	<p><b>Animal Research.</b> Use the internet and books to find out facts about the animal. Find out whether it comes from an egg, how it grows, what it eats, where it lives, how big it is, what it needs to be healthy etc. Choose how your record what you find out-poster, booklet, video, model</p>	<p><b>Photo hunt.</b> Ask your adults to get out their old photos and talk about them to you. How have people changed? What was different when mummy and daddy were younger? and when Grandparents were younger?</p>	<p><b>Scavenger hunt.</b> Can you find different items in your house or garden? How about an item starting with each letter of the alphabet? Or the names of Different family members? How about different colours?</p>
<p><b>Bake a treat.</b> Choose a recipe and help a grown up to bake it. See if you can be in charge of the measuring. Can you listen to the instructions and follow them correctly?</p>	<p><b>Write a message.</b> Write a message to your teacher on Tapestry to tell them what you've been doing, maybe you can send a photo. Your teacher may write back!</p>	<p><b>Spring search.</b> Go outside (or just in the garden) and notice signs of Spring, can you find buds on trees, flowers growing, baby animals? Take photos or draw what you find.</p>	<p><b>Construction competition.</b> Have a Duplo/Lego/construction contest with your family. What do you like about each person's model? How can you change your model? Can you teach someone to make a model like yours?</p>
<p><b>Paper aeroplane.</b> Ask a grown up to show you how to make paper aeroplanes or use Youtube to help. Test them out outside, measure the distance with a tape measure. Which one goes the furthest?</p>	<p><b>Obstacle Course.</b> Make an inside or outside obstacle course like Ninja Warrior, what can you use to travel over, under and through? Time yourself to complete the challenge using a grown up's phone, can you improve your time?</p>	<p><b>Home Cinema.</b> Have a 'Home Cinema' and talk about the film. Who was your favourite character? Why? Stop the film half way through, how might the film end? Can you draw your favourite part of the film?</p>	<p><b>Junk modelling.</b> Go on hunt for used boxes, tubes and pots. Can you make an amazing model with them?</p>
