## **Fair Funding petition – please come to school reception and sign it!**

You will know only too well that school budgets are under pressure. The national budget for education is shared out on a basis that is lost in history and is manifestly unfair.

Gloucestershire schools and academies suffer as a consequence. The government has given a commitment to introduce fair funding but there is real urgency about making progress. The higher funded regions receive on average £6,300 per child, the lower funded regions (of which Gloucestershire is one) received on average £4,200 per child. We would like to be able to continue to provide your child with an education that is on par with any region in the country, but because of the present funding allocation it is becoming increasingly difficult. Please help us to provide the education that your children deserve by signing this petition to show that Gloucestershire is not going to sit back and let this situation continue - after all we all pay the same taxes wherever we live! The petition for you to sign will be left on the signing in desk in the main school reception - thank you.

## "Scrumptious School Dinners", Says Y6

The staff all agree that the new school dinner menu offers some really good tasty home cooking, although we understand that some of the children are reluctant to try dishes they are not familiar with. Please encourage your children to try something they have not had before; we are sure they will be pleasantly surprised with the taste and flavours.

We interviewed three Y6 pupils and this is what they had to say:-

**Zainab Sambo** - "I really enjoy the school meals and they are different to what I have had before. I like how we have a different variety to choose from and in particular I like and can recommend the veggie bangers and mashed potato, the battered fish with chips and the chick pea and vegetable hotpot that tasted delicious. The jacket potato choices are also lovely and filled with a variety of toppings. The puddings are lush!"

**Edgars Kadnivkova** - "My favourite meal has been the Mixed Bean Cassoulet with cous cous which Mrs Simmonds also thought was very tasty. Neither of us knew what it was, but we just tried it anyway and look forward to the next time it features on the menu. I also like that we have a large variety of puddings, though my favourite one was the amazing bread and butter pudding. I highly recommend the apple and cherry cobbler with custard, yum yum."

**Sidney Hurcombe** - "Thursdays of Week 3 is my favourite meal because there is red pepper frittata with new potatoes (in case you don't know what a frittata is, it's a bit like an omelette). Try it and find out. My other favourite is sweet and sour Quorn with noodles, a great veggie option. I like to be very experimental and one day I tried cucumber from the salad bar with custard as a pudding - it was fab!"

Basically these Y6 pupils were very enthusiastic about most of the dishes on offer and would encourage others to try it.

There is a special menu on **Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> October (Cowboy Special Day)**, and we would like everyone in school to have a meal then, please. It's School Census day and this is when our funding for meals is calculated on how many children take a school dinner in KS1. Basically if not enough children take a school dinner on that day we will have to make up any shortfall to the actual cost of our catering contract from other monies that could be used for resources. The meals are universally free to everyone in KS1 so please have one on 1<sup>st</sup> October at least, when the

## School Trips... how to pay... it's a new way!

### **Important changes – please read below**

Back in June we notified parents via the school newsletter that we intend to change the way we take payments for school trips, as we are working towards becoming a cashless school office.

This academic year we will not be taking cheque or cash payments for school trips via the school office. Payments will instead be made online via ParentPay the same as for dinner money.

To pay for trips parents/carers will need to logon to their child's ParentPay account (if you cannot remember your username or password then please come and ask us in the school office). You will then need to select the correct item to pay against, e.g. Y3 Stone Age Trip or Y4 Rainforest Trip. It is essential that parents/carers select the correct item to pay for at this stage, make sure you don't accidentally pick up and put the money into school dinners by mistake! You can of course select to top up your school dinner fund as well at the same time and add that to your basket as well.

Having selected the correct item, e.g. Y3 Stone Age Trip, you will be asked to pay online, like any other online shop or payment facility. It's really easy.

If you need to pay by cash at PayPoint, then you will need to come to collect a separate bar coded letter. The one you already have is for dinners only and each item will have a bar code specific to it. Again, if you use the bar code you might already have then that money would go to your child's dinner money account and not the trip, by mistake!

Any problems during this transition period, then please pop in to the office and we will gladly help you.

Y3 and Y4 parents are the first to use this new facility with their school trips coming up, so good luck to them and thank you all for your support. It's going well.
